Clothing items

- One pair of shoes
- One pair of long pants
- Two T-shirts
- One long sleeve shirt
- Sweatshirt or fleece pullover
- Two pair of socks and underwear
- Hands-free flashlight or strap for mini-mag
- Pair of dry shoes or boots
- Hat

Other Necessities

- Bible
- Sleeping bag
- Flashlight (waterproof)
- Toiletries and sunscreen lotion
- Small travel towel
- Swimsuit
- River sandals or shoes
- Raincoat or poncho
- Sunglasses
- Insect Repellent
- Straps for your glasses/sunglasses
- Fishing tackle (optional)- take a tackle box no larger than 6"x 6"
- Some cash for dinner Sunday night (we will eat a quick dinner at Burger King on the way to the river)
- Waterproof dry bag (do not use a trash bag for this!). I suggest a Sealine 55 dry bag or one comparable which is large enough for your gear. But not so large it will sink a canoe! A dry bag is a necessity, or your gear will be wet all week

Campers are not permitted to bring the following items:

- Electronics of any kind (Cell phones, camera, etc.)
- Skateboards
- Pets
- Firearms, knives, Fireworks
- Alcohol, Cigarettes, or Drugs

As you can see, your clothing requirements are minimal. However, remember that the conditions on the river change rapidly. You must shield yourself from the sun. You must also be prepared to spend the day in rainy, chilly weather. Remember to take only what is necessary-everything you take travels with you for over 50 miles.
